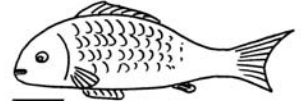
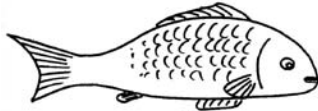

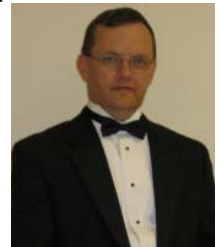
Princes of Jerusalem

Abbott Scholarship

Named for Leon M. Abbott, Sovereign Grand Commander from 1921 to 1932, the Scholarship Program provides financial support for the continuing education of young men and women from Scottish Rite families and Masonic-related youth groups. Since 1951, more than \$3 million has been awarded to students from each state of the Northern Jurisdiction.

Eligibility: The following criteria are used to determine the eligibility of applicants for the program:

- A currently enrolled freshman, sophomore, junior or senior at an accredited college or university.
- A minimum grade point average of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale. (Freshman scholarships will be distributed after an acceptable GPA is submitted, following the first semester.)
- A child or grandchild of a Scottish Rite Mason in the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction.
- A member of a youth organization sponsored by the Masonic fraternity in the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction.
- A graduate of one of the 32° Masonic Learning Centers for Children in the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction.

We have made several improvements to the Cathedral building in 2010. We completed the entire re-roofing project; an additional parking lot was created; hand railing on the west side kitchen entrance as well as an air curtain at the kitchen entrance were installed; the freight elevator was overhauled; and the ladies restroom and lounge were updated and made handicap accessible. We were able to accomplish these projects while providing general maintenance to sustain operation of the building. The cost to operate the Cathedral is \$1,200 per day. Our next project is to install a new men's restroom adjacent to the west ladies restroom and lounge.

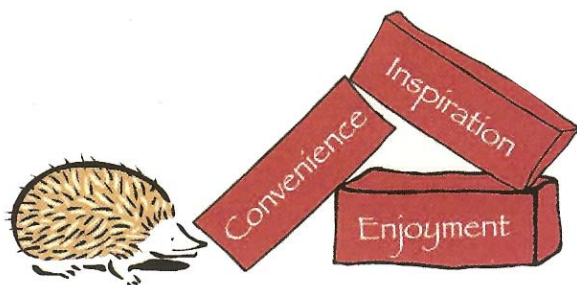
